PREE consists of two pillars:

PREE to provide recommendations for the host economy on how implementation of their energy efficiency action plans could be improved, and Follow-up PREE to help a previous PREE host economy to more smoothly implement recommendations on energy efficiency action plans

Energy Efficiency Policy (EEP) Workshop to further discuss key issues in policy formation for energy efficiency



11.b. (2) Progress of PREE

Phase 8:

1. PREE

≻The 12th PREE in Russia, originally scheduled for October 2018, is postponed.

2. Energy Efficiency Policy (EEP) Workshop

The 4th EEP Workshop was held in Hong Kong, China on 18 March 2019 in conjunction with EGEEC 53 and EGNRET 52.

> The main theme was transport fuel economy regulations.

Phase 9:

1. Follow-up PREE

Follow-up PREE in Peru was conducted on 18-22 March 2019 in Lima, Peru.



11.b. (3) Follow-Up PREE in Peru

- 3 days of workshop, 1 day of site visit and 1 day of recommendations preparation and presentation to the Peruvian government
- The Review Expert Team was composed by 6 experts from 5 APEC economies:

11.b. (3) Follow-Up PREE in Peru (Cont'd)

- The experts gave **51** preliminary recommendations on 7 subsectors.
- Around 40 participants and 26 presentations from 12 different relevant organisations
- APERC is now working on the draft report for Follow-Up PREE and will circulated it to EWG members and APEC Secretariat before

EWG 58.





11.b. (4) Energy Efficiency Policy Workshop

- 41 representatives from 9 economies attended the workshop in Hong Kong, China.
- Focused on energy efficiency in the transport sector including policy for : fuel economy regulations, electric vehicles and charging infrastructure deployment
- Coordinated by a consultant with presentations by invited experts from New Zealand, Chile and Hong Kong, China
- Included a panel and group discussion sessions
- Summary report will be circulated and published on the APEC and APERC websites.
