- > promote low-carbon energy policies on supply side like PREE on demand side;
- >promote low-emission power sources such as renewable energy, nuclear and fossil fuel with CCS; and
- >provide recommendations for the host economy.



12.b. Progress of PRLCE

- Phase 1 (2012-2013): Thailand, the Philippines
- Phase 2 (2013-2014): Indonesia, Malaysia
- Phase 3 (2014-2016): Viet Nam
- Phase 4 (2017): Papua New Guinea
